

Finishing Your Project



Congratulations on completing all of your stitches. You officially have a finish. Now the fun begins. How do you want to fully finish your project? There are a variety of ways to fully finish your project. This is always a very personal choice.

What does fully finishing mean? Most simply, it is placing your project in a state that you are happy with. For some, this means placing it in the under-the-bed box or hanging in a closet using shorts/pants hangers. For others, fully finishing means creating a pillow or framing the piece to display in their house. I have also seen some stitchers place small projects in scrap books or journals. I encourage you to be creative.

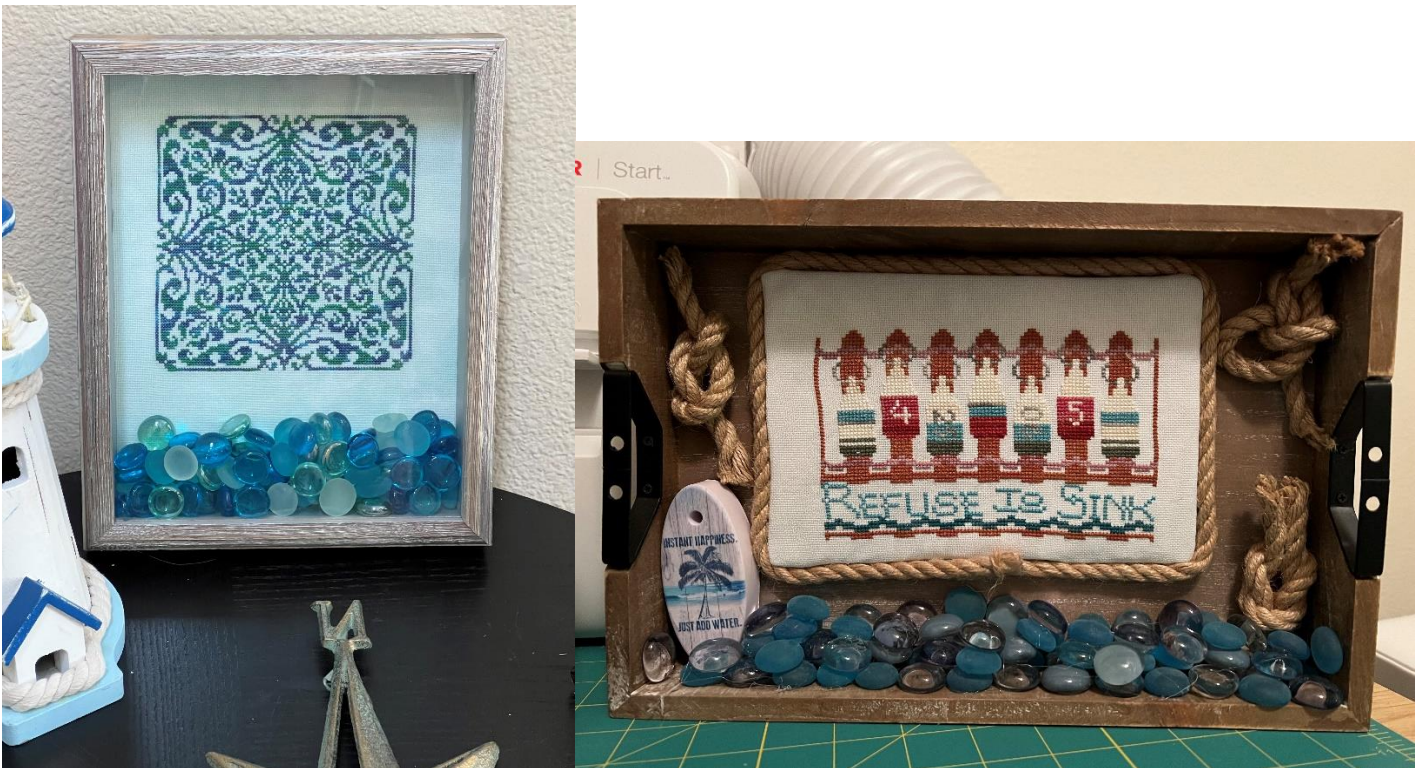
My favorite finishes include framing in a standard frame, framing in a shadow box and decorating, or finishing in a hoop. Future courses will have a tutorial on how to finish in a hoop.
